FOOD SERVICES OFFICERS **URGENTLY** REQUIRE SAFETY TRAINING

In 2021

A brutal assault of a Food Services Officer (FOS) took place at a federal prison:

➤ Correctional Service Canada was found in violation of the Canada Labour Code for not providing **mandatory training**, exposing FOS in that prison to the threat of assault.

In 2022

Through a national survey, USJE finds that:

➤ a similar lack of training exists for FOS across the country, exposing all FOS to a threat of assault.



THE FACTS

2 in **3**

Food Services Officers presently lack the training required to keep them safe.

3 in **4**

work in understaffed kitchens.

9 in **10**

receive NO safety training before their first day of work.

FOOD SERVICES OFFICERS URGENTLY REQUIRE THE FOLLOWING **SAFETY TRAININGS**

- New Employee Orientation Program (NEOP)– including Anatomy of a Set Up – **in person**
- NEOP, Part II
- Dynamic Security
- Managing Offenders in the Workplace
- Self defense
- Communicating about Offenders
- Working Mind First Responder (Previously Road to Mental Readiness)
- CSPA Security Awareness
- First Aid & CPR

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All new FOS (casual, term & indeterminate) need to receive these trainings **BEFORE** their first day of work.

All present FOS (casual, term & indeterminate) need to receive all of the above trainings that they have not yet received.
